Machon Programs for Summer 2025 with dates and rates:

Full Summer Options*

- o **Machon Full Summer (** 1st session training, 2nd session living in the bunk)
 - Tuition \$6,249 (\$5,999 for URJ Congregation Members) + \$180 security fee
 - **6/8-8/1**
- Machon Israel 2.0** (1st session training, 2nd session in Israel for 3 weeks)
 - Tuition \$12,150 (\$11,900 for URJ Congregation Members) + \$180 security fee
 - RootOne offers a \$3000 voucher
 - Registration through Yallah! Israel and a Machon application will be available in November and is a required part of the process.
 - **6/8-7/29**
 - 6/8-7/8 at camp
 - 7/8-7/29 in Israel

Partial Summer Options*

- o Machon 6 Week (1st session training, 2nd session living in the bunk for 2 weeks)
 - Tuition \$\$5,945 (\$5,695 for URJ Congregation Members) + \$180 security fee

- o Machon Adventure Program (1 week adventure trip out of camp, 2nd session training)
 - Tuition \$\$5,525 (\$5,275 for URJ Congregation Members) + \$180 security fee

Machon Israel 2.0 FAQ'S

Can a Machon Israel 2.0 participant take part in only the 2nd session Israel portion of the program and not participate in the 1st session Coleman component of the program?

No. The Machon-Israel program is a full-summer program and participants are required to attend Camp Coleman 1st session and travel to Israel with Coleman 2nd session.

Does the Machon Israel 2.0 trip require a deposit?

Yes, a \$500 administrative fee is required and fully refundable until February 14th. If an applicant is not accepted into the Machon program, the deposit will be refunded.

Is there a limit on how many participants can be accepted into Machon Israel 2.0?

There is always a limit, but we will strive to accommodate all teens who wish to participate and will be better able to accommodate those who register earliest.

How will Machon Israel 2.0 participants travel from camp to Israel for the group departure airport to connect with their trans-Atlantic flight to Israel?

Camp Coleman will transport the Machon Israel participants to Atlanta and the teens will fly together from Atlanta Hartsfield-Jackson Airport to the group departure airport. Our Coleman staff will coordinate domestic flight arrangements and be in contact with families at the appropriate time. Families are responsible for paying the domestic flights.
